

Oldest Carrick moves from Soo to Windsor Spitfires

Jake Carrick will be playing his hockey a little closer to his home town. And on a contender, to boot.

After three full seasons and a part of this year with the Sault Ste. Marie Greyhounds of the Ontario Hockey League, the 20-year-old Stouffville native and overage forward was dealt to the Windsor Spitfires at the league's trade deadline Monday.

In exchange, the Greyhounds will receive overage defenceman Brent Sullivan and four draft picks, including a fourth-round selection in the 2012 OHL priority selection.

The 14-21-5-0 Greyhounds made several moves Monday, including firing head coach Denny Lambert. Windsor is 21-15-1-1.

Carrick completed his time in the Soo with his first career hat trick during in a 6-4 loss to the London Knights Sunday.

The gritty five-foot, 11-inch, 185-pound Carrick had 13 goals, 16 assists and 93 penalty minutes in 34 games with the Greyhounds this year.

One brother, Toronto Maple Leaf draft pick Sam Carrick, plays for Brampton in the OHL.

Younger brother Trevor has signed with Mississauga of the OHL. The 2010 draft pick is having a solid rookie season with the

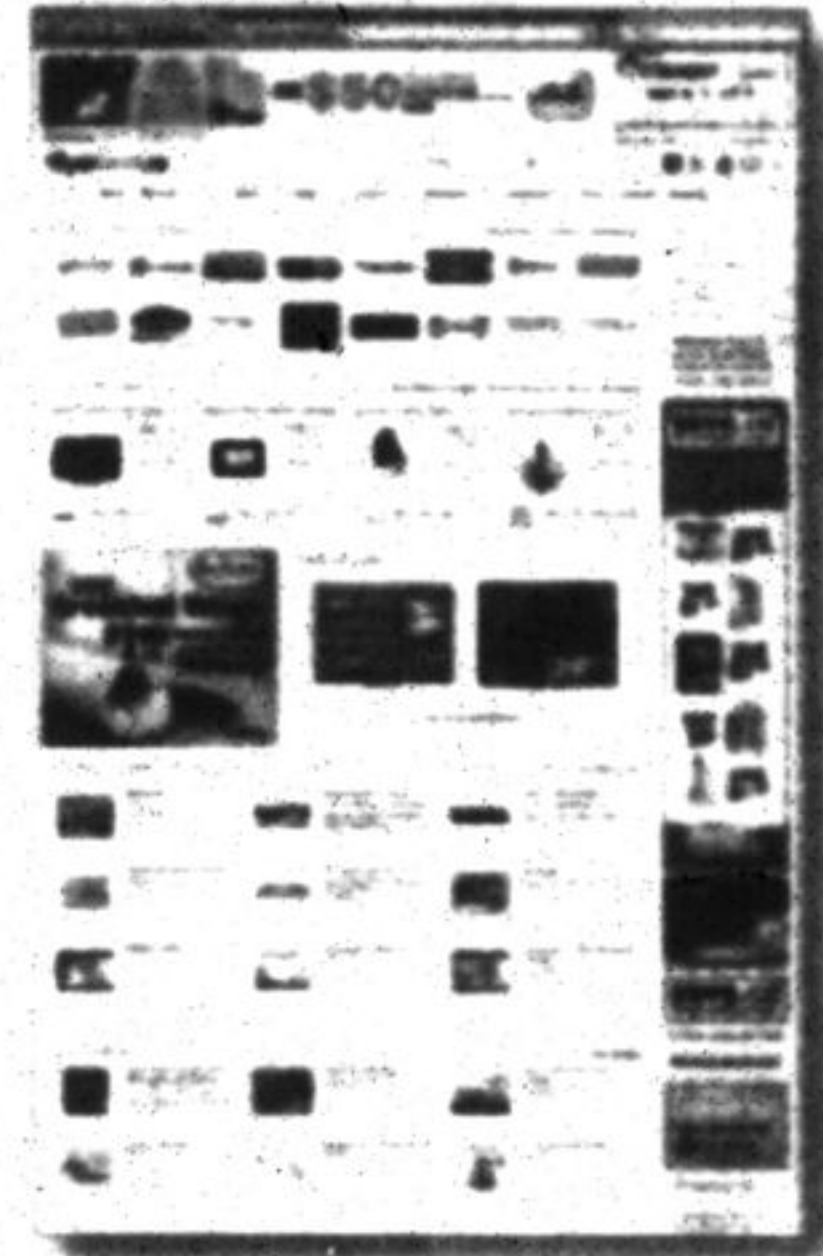
