southern Ontario home.

Mr. Murray ... was acquitted in 2000.

The fact the tapes existed wasn't revealed publicly until after Crown officials made a deal with Ms Homolka, in

which she agreed to plead guilty to two manslaughter charges and spend 12 years in prison in exchange for her testimony. against her ex-husband.

Mr. Murray, who retrieved the tapes at Mr. Bernardo's direction in 1993 and held them for more than 16 months before disclosing them to John Rosen. his successor, was acquitted in 2000.
