GAME NOTES: In playing a team that has been struggling all season in the Collingwood Blackhawks, Stouffville Spirit head coach Craig Donovan had three objectives for his club last weekend. Foremost was to

get two victories. Along with that, he hoped his club would avoid any unnecessary injuries since the playoffs are just around the corner. Just as important, he hoped his players would not display any bad habits with their performance. In the end, the Spirit met Donovan's expectations after skating off with a 7-1 road win Friday and a 14-1 victory at the Stouffville Arena Sunday against the North Division cellar-dwelling Blackhawks.

In Friday's contest, the Spirit broke open a scoreless first period with four goals in the second stanza to take a 4-1 lead. Decian Gunovski had two of the goals, including one with a man advantage, while Chris Porter and Dylan Savory added the other goals. Gunovski completed his hat trick in the third period while Tyler von Engelbrechten and Billy Lovatsis added power-play markers to round out the scoring. Mike Sheremeta stopped 17 of 18 shots, to earn the win. The Spirit directed 38 shots on the Blackhawks' net.

In Sunday's affair, unanswered goals by Gunovski, Matt Neal and Christian Finch on the power play, staked the Spirit to a 3-0 lead after the opening stanza. In the second period, Finch and von Engelbrechten each netted a pair while Andrew Doyle and Kory Kennedy on the power play each added one to stake the Spirit to a commanding 9-1 lead after two periods. The Spirit continued to apply the pressure in the third period as they lit the red light five more times including a pair from Adam Vandersluis and one. from Lovatsis, all on the power play, and even strength markers from Jack Caradonna and Kennedy to round out the scoring. The Spirit outshot the Blackhawks 39-21. The two victories improved the Spirit's undefeated streak to four games and enabled them to gain at least one point in their last 14 outings.

INSIDER: The Spirit's performance of late has caught the attention of the Canadian Junior Hockey League as it gave them honourable mention listing for their last two top-20 rankings, including Monday's.

Neal is second in league scoring with 93 points (37 goals and 56 assists) while Finch is eighth with 77 (27 goals, 50 assists).

Among goalkeepers, Sheremeta is ninth with a 2.80 goals against average in 22 games.

The Spirit played Sunday's game without three regulars, including Tyler Ferry, who was summoned by the London Knights of the Ontario Hockey League. Drafted by the Knights two years ago, Ferry had an assist in his OHL debut, a 6-4 home loss to the Ene Otters Friday. In Sunday's game at Brampton. Ferry had three helpers. Ferry will return to play for the Spirit if there is not a schedule conflict with the Spirit and the Knights for the rest of this year. Donovan anticipates Ferry will remain with the Knights next season. Also missing from the Spirit roster were forwards Drake Caggiula, who was on a recruiting trip to the University of Maine, and Justin Mcdonald, who was playing with the Stayner Siskins Junior C club.

GENERALLY SPEAKING: "Obviously, Colling-wood is struggling and it's been a long year for them. They're frustrated," Donovan said. "Our objective was to avoid any serious injuries in our two games against them, don't fall into any bad habits and get four points, and we did that."

The Spirit has four games left in the regular season, including games in Aurora Finday and Georgetown Saturday.

"Aurora is still fighting for a playoff spot and they're running out of games. This will be one of their biggest games of the year and Georgetown is battling with us for playoff seeding," Donovan said. "These games will be tougher for us for sure."
