

Minor bantam, midget Clippers into OMHA quarter-finals

The Stouffville minor bantam Clippers swept the Richmond Hill Stars in three games in their second-round, best-of-five Ontario Minor Hockey Association A-level playoff series, capped by a 2-1 win at the Clippers complex Saturday.

Duncan Allen scored the game-winning marker in the second period and earned an assist on the first goal by Jordan Brillinger.

Jeremy Hughes and Ryan Daniels each collected one assist.

The Clippers opened the series with a dramatic 2-1 overtime win at the Stouffville Arena Jan. 26.

Adam Doren scored the game-winning marker with 10.7 seconds remaining in the extra session.

Taylor Peterson scored the Clippers' first goal and earned an assist on Doren's marker.

Hughes was credited with an assist on Peterson's goal.

In the second game at Richmond Hill Friday, the Clippers got goals from Ben Sear, Peterson, Braydon McNeil and Doren to win 4-3.

Hughes earned three assists while Mitch Witherspoon and Nathan Watson each had one.

The Clippers advance to the quarter-finals, with their opponent and dates yet to be announced.

Midgets sweep Nobleking

The Stouffville major midget Clippers advanced to the OMHA A quarter-finals by sweeping their best-of-five series against the defending minor midget champion Nobleking Knights. The Clippers won the last game 4-0 on the road Monday.

With the game less than two minutes old, the Clippers jumped out to a 2-0 lead on goals by Marco Mastrangelo and Curtis Crago.

Any chance of a comeback were dampened when Craig Hasler scored to give the Clippers a 3-0 lead before the period concluded.

Dalton Mills scored the final goal in the third period. Kyle Sauro and Josh Machesney assisted.

Sal Rabito posted the shutout and received a strong defensive effort from blueliners Joe Palladino, Brandon Hughes, Will Brown, Daniel Perry and James McLeod.

Coming off a three-game sweep of their first-round series against Innisfil, the Clippers won the opening game 5-3 Friday.

Trailing 3-1 early in the third period, the Clippers stormed back to tie the game with a pair of goals by Machesney within an eight-second span. Less than two minutes later, Crago scored the game-winning marker.

Mastrangelo and Mills added

the other goals. McLeod, Sauro, Adam Kostandoff, Perry, Crago and Machesney added assists.

With the series resuming at the Stouffville Arena Sunday, the Clippers jumped out to a commanding 9-2 lead after two periods before settling for a 9-4 win.

Hasler, Connor Cadaret and Taylor Clifford each had two goals for the Clippers while singles went to McLeod, Machesney and Crago. Adam Kostandoff, Mastrangelo, Clifford, Mills, Cadaret, Machesney and Hasler recorded assists.

Kyle Pontone picked up the win in the Stouffville net.

The Clippers now await the winner of the Richmond Hill-East Gwillimbury series.

Stouffville will host the Ontario Hockey Federation championships this spring. The event, which is slated to run from April 8 to 10 at the Stouffville Arena, will feature the midget A champions from the OMHA, Greater Toronto Hockey League, the Alliance, Northern

Ontario Minor Hockey Association and the host Clippers.
