FIREFIGHTER SAW SMOKE, JUMPED INTO ACTION

Drug lab heroics not his first rescue

Gord Hooper had come into Stouffville to run a couple of errands.

But when he saw a huge cloud of thick, black smoke to the south of where he was on Main Street, the off-duty Markham Fire and Emergency Services captain had to check it out.

What the Goodwood resident found early Monday afternoon was an elderly woman, who spoke limited English, standing on the front porch of 55 Merdock Ct., which was on fire.

"She was pretty frantic," Mr. Hooper said. "The thing was rolling. The house was pretty much involved."

What he figured out from the woman was that her husband was still inside and someone else may be in the basement.

In just his civilian clothes, Mr. Hooper, a 31-year veteran of fire-fighting, entered the front door and crawled around looking for the two people.

"I just tried doing a normal

"It's such a popular event, people are lined up 60 to 70 deep," Mr. Bannon said.
