# Weather plays havoc with Spartans

Despite having sewn up first place in their division of the York Region Athletic Association tier one standings, the Stouffville District Secondary School Spartans junior boys' hockey team was hoping they could play their final regular season game against Markham's Brother Andre Cardinals Wednesday.

Although the game was meaningless to the Spartans, head coach Jamie Hewitt noted it's been close to a month since his club last played any meaningful game.

Unfortunately for the Spartans, Mother Nature wasn't too co-operative after invading York Region late Tuesday and into the early hours of Wednesday by blanketing the area with snow.

That forced a cancellation of their game and other YRAA sports that day.

While it would make sense for the Spartans and Cardinals just to set another day to play, Hewitt noted that was impossible to do since the first round of playoffs began Thursday. The Cardinals were part of the first round schedule and had to travel to Georgina for a single-elimination game against Keswick.

"It would have been nice to play," Hewitt said. "We haven't played in a while, since the first week of January, but there's nothing you can do about it."

In earning a first-round bye and being the second overall seed in the YRAA standings, Hewitt was concerned his team might exhibit some rust when they play their next game in the quarter-finals against the second-lowest seed when the first round of the playoffs conclude and surviving teams are re-seeded.

"The first period could tell us quite a bit,"

he said. "But I'm not too worried about that. We have some practices between now and our first game."

Also having their regular season schedule disrupted by the snowstorm were the Spartans senior and junior boys' basketball teams.

The Spartan seniors were to have played Sir William Mulock (Newmarket) in their final YRAA tier two regular season game while the juniors were to have hosted St. Elizabeth (Thornhill).

Both games are rescheduled for Monday at Stouffville starting with the junior game at 4 p.m. followed by the seniors at 5:15 p.m.

Entering the final game, the Spartan juniors and seniors sport identical 2-0 win-loss records and are in first place in their respective divisions.

The Spartan girls' varsity hockey team had their road game against St. Robert (Thornhill) postponed.

No makeup date has yet been scheduled.

However, the Spartans are scheduled to resume league play Monday when they travel to Newmarket to face Sir William Mulock Monday at 4 p.m.

Unaffected by the inclement weather were the Spartan junior and senior girls' volleyball teams, who will conclude regular season play at Brother Andre Monday at 3:30 p.m. with games against the host Cardinals and Bill Crothers (Unionville).

## Sleepy Hollow women's champ heads Ontario golf association
