CRIME: No injuries, weapon in CIBC holdup

Bank robber still on loose

A man fled Stouffville's Main Street CIBC on foot after robbing it Monday morning. At about 10:40 a.m. York Regional Police were notified of the robbery. No weapon was seen and only two other customers were in the bank at the time, according to Sgt. Gary Phillips of York Regional Police. "Nobody was injured, which is the best thing," he said. The suspect fled with cash, but the amount is unknown, according to Sgt. Phillips. The bank, at the corner of Main and Market streets, was taped off for much of the day as officers processed the scene and

canvassed local merchants for video surveillance footage. The suspect is described as white, male, 5 feet, 8 inches, medium build, in his late 50s with slightly greying hair. He was wearing a black leather jacket, blue jeans, black hat and sunglasses.
