Outdoor smoking bylaw fizzles

User groups asked to butt out at sports fields

Whitchurch-Stouffville council is hoping a letter requesting users of the town's sports fields, along with peer pressure, will be enough to get coaches, parents and spectators to butt out.

"Why would a coach stand behind a bench with a bunch of kids and smoke? It doesn't make sense," Mayor Wayne Emmerson said during a council meeting Tuesday night.

Last month, York Region council adopted a recommendation that all nine of its municipalities consider implementing a smoke-free bylaw for outdoor recreational spaces. The ban could also include, but is not limited to, transit stops and uncovered outdoor restaurant patios.

Whitchurch-Stouffville council voted that request down Tuesday in favour of sending letters to user groups. Councillors Ken Ferdinands and Phil Bannon were not at the meeting.

"Our bylaw staff are already strapped and you shouldn't put

Leavens scored a pair of first-

period goals, including his first of the playoffs less than two minutes into the game, as the Hurricanes skated to a 4-1 Game 3 victory over the Stouffville Spirit at the Ray Twinney Complex Tuesday night to climb back into a best-of-seven Ontario Junior Hockey League quarter-final playoff series.
