Imagine what it's like should an Anglo-Saxon be transplanted into India, China or Africa.

At the same time, imagine what it's like for a resident of Africa, India or China to be relocated in Canada. Culture shock to say the least.

So what do people do? Many take or bring their deep-rooted cultures with them.

So it is in Stouffville. And so it is with Ayesha Wasin, a 17-year-old Muslim, born here but with parentage from Sri Lanka. She's a Grade 12 student at Stouffville District Secondary School.

What makes Ayesha unique is the fact she wears a hijab headpiece and a Niqab veil that, together, converts to a burqa. This garment, in its entirety, covers the entire body except for a mesh screen facial slot that reveals only her eyes.

Ayesha was five when her parents and two older brothers moved from Scarborough to Stouffville. She attended Glad Park Public School from Grade 1 through graduation.

Her father had his heart set on farming. Her mother wanted a home in the country. Their dreams have been realized. They own a 250-acre property near Zephyr, complete with cows, llamas, goats, donkeys and chickens.

Wearing a Niquab, Ayesha explains, is something for which she wished even as a small girl. At age 12, she took three months off school to accompany her family on a long-distance trip that included visits to Sri Lanka, Saudi Arabia, Switzerland, Dubai and England. While in Sri Lanka, she became convinced this garment was meant for her. She's been wearing one of more than 20 different styles and colours ever since.

While Glad Park students were accepting, such was not the case at SDSS, Ayesha said. Not

initially.

"It wasn't understood," she recalls. "There was some joking around."

But Ayesha persevered, knowing that, eventually, the teasing would stop.

It did. Today, through quiet enlightenment, she's accepted by her peers as one of their own

From the beginning, my attire was always acknowledged by staff, Ayesha adds.

The concealment, for religious reasons, poses no complexities for Ayesha at school. Badminton, basketball and soccer are favourite sports. She doesn't wear the hijab/niqab dress within her family circle or when communing with other girls.

"It's a symbol of equality," she states, "where brains are respected more than beauty."

An A-student, Ayesha plans to enroll in a biomedical course at the University of Western Ontario following graduation in June.

While a modern worship site has yet to be established in Whitchurch-Stouffville, Ayesha and her parents hope this will some day be realized. At present, a meeting place called Darul-khair centre is located on Main Street next to Ann's Fabrics.

For Muslims, Jummahs are held Friday afternoons with prayer times five times daily.

Because Ayesha has lived 12 of her 17 years in Stouffville, she's grown accustomed to life here. But she still misses friends in Scarborough. However, nothing surpasses her love of the family farm where she can ride a four-wheeler - with or without a burga.
