## Show selection in jury's hands

What is good art?

It's one of those questions that has no right answer. But on March 29, three prestigious members of the art world will decide what they believe to be at least worthy of being in the Latcham Gallery's annual juried exhibition.

"It's very exciting for the (artists), I believe, because they are being judged by professionals," said Latcham Gallery curator Ola Wlusek.

Judging this year's show is artist and instructor Jack Butler, curator for the Frederick Horsman Varley Art Gallery of Markham Anik Glaude and photography curator for the Art Gallery of Ontario Maia-Mari Sut-

Selecting the works to be displayed during the exhibition, which runs from April 2 to May 14, will be done blindly. The judges will not know the name of the artist or anything about him or her.

"The artwork stands on its own," Ms Wlusek said. "There is no other connection or bias. It's really just about the pieces being selected, which is great."

Every year, for more than 20 years, the downtown Stouffville gallery has received about 150 pieces of art, ranging from sculptures to watercolours to installations and photographs for judging, with sometimes as few as 10 being selected for the show.

"We don't know what we're going to get until the drop off of work," Ms Wlusek said.

"Any time your artwork is in view at a public gallery ... that in itself creates the prestige." Anytime your work is included in an exhibition among other artists is an honour, she said.

The exhibition is open to all artists living in Ontario, working in any medium. The only parameters for entries is the pieces must be ready for exhibition. A maximum of two original works from 2009 to 2011 can be submitted by each artist and work previously

submitted to the gallery's juried show or done under instruction are not eligible.

The artwork can be no larger than 6.5 feet by 4 feet so it can fit through the gallery's front door.

All work to be considered for the show must be dropped off at Latcham Gallery, 6240 Main St., March 28 between noon and 8 p.m.

Judging will take place the next day and selected artists will be notified by phone that day.

An opening reception, which includes a presentation of the jurors' awards, will be held April 2 from 1 to 3 p.m.
