

Knox invited to national hockey team's camp

Liz Knox is was among 37 players selected to attend the national women's hockey team selection camp in Toronto.

The 22-year-old Stouffville resident, who is in her fifth season with the Wilfrid Laurier University women's hockey team, was among four goalkeepers chosen.

The camp will be held at the MasterCard Centre in Toronto from April 2 to 5.

The roster will be reduced to form the 21-player roster that will represent Canada at the 2011 International Ice Hockey Federation World Women's Championships in Switzerland from April 16 to 25.

Acton sparks Lake State in first-round sweep

By winning the series, the Lakers will advance to the second round of the CCHA playoffs for the first time since the 2006-07 season.

The Lakers will play at Notre Dame Friday and Saturday in a two-game quarter-final series.

Acton is the son of Toronto Maple Leafs' assistant coach Keith Acton. His brother, Robbie, is a first-year forward with the Spirit this season.

Hughes leads Cornell to ECAC hockey title

Hayley Hughes scored one goal and collected two assists to help the Cornell University Big Red women's hockey team capture its second consecutive ECAC Hockey Tournament title with a 3-0 win over Dartmouth College at Ithaca, N.Y., Saturday.

The Stouffville resident, who is in her senior year, was credited with an assist on the game's first

goal by Chelsea Karpenko at the 6:42-mark of first period.

In the second period, Hughes earned an assist on Karpenko's second goal of the game at the 7:18-mark to give the Big Red a 2-0 lead.

Hughes scored the game's third goal at the 6:54 mark of third period to round out the scoring before a crowd of 2,711 spectators at the Lynah Rink, the largest crowd in Cornell women's hockey history.

With the victory, the Big Red earned an automatic berth into the National Collegiate Athletic Association tournament.

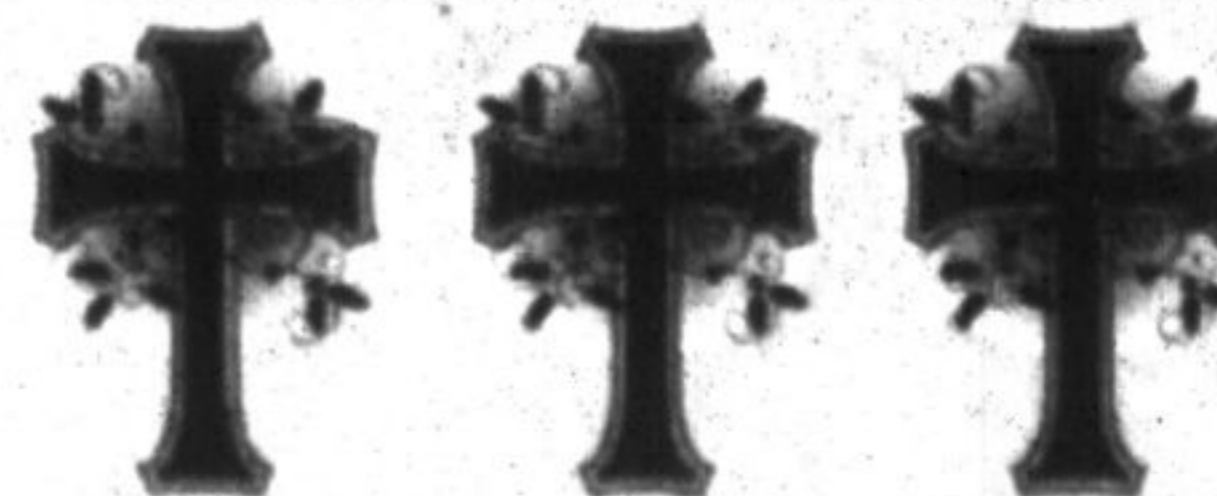
