

# Hughes skates to women's NCAA Frozen Four

Hayley Hughes collected one assist to help propel the Cornell University Big Red women's hockey team to a 7-1 win over Dartmouth College in a National Collegiate Athletic Association quarter-final match at Ithaca, N.Y., Saturday and a berth in this weekend's Frozen Four championships.

The Stouffville resident, who is in her senior year, earned an assist on Catherine White's goal in the second period that gave the Big Red a 3-1 lead.

With the victory, the second-ranked Big Red will make their second consecutive Frozen Four appearance.

Sporting a 31-2-1 overall mark this season, Cornell will face Boston University in one semifinal, while Boston College will meet Wisconsin in the other semi. The games will be played tomorrow in Erie, Pa.

## Major atom Clippers advance to York Simcoe final

Four Whitchurch-Stouffville residents were members of the Markham Waxers AAA midgets that finished fourth at the Ontario Minor Hockey Association AAA championships in Newmarket last weekend.

David Beloff led the Waxers in scoring and was in a three-way tie for top honours with six points (one goal, five assists in five games). Shawn Hulshof compiled three goals and two assists while Steven Tait had two goals and one assist and Kevin Stevens one goal, two assists.

The Waxers lost their first game to Oakville 7-2 last Friday and then battled Whitby to a 4-4 tie later that

day. The Waxers then defeated the Brampton Battalion 5-2 Saturday before suffering a heartbreaking 2-1 loss to the York Simcoe Express to conclude round-robin play.

Facing the same Express for the bronze medal, the Waxers fell 3-1.

## Acton hopes to cap career with CCHA award today

Will Acton concluded his collegiate hockey career at Lake Superior State University after his club took eighth-ranked Notre Dame University to the three-game limit in their Central Collegiate Hockey Association second round playoff series before falling 4-2 in South Bend, Ind., Sunday.

The Stouffville native and former Stouffville Spirit forward who is in his senior year earned an assist for the Lakers in a 3-2 overtime loss in last Friday's series opener.

The Lakers forced a third game after winning the second game 4-3 Saturday.

Acton has been nominated for a CCHA postseason award. He's up against Miami-of Ohio's Reilly Smith and Carl Hagelin of Michigan for the best defensive forward trophy.

The CCHA awards banquet will be held today at the Fox Theater in Detroit during the league's championship tournament.

The son of longtime Toronto Maple Leafs assistant coach Keith Acton, Will had nine goals and 15 assists in 34 games played this

season.

Last season, he was named the club's most-improved player for the second time and its unsung hero.

## Knox, Crago on Laurier's fourth-place CIS squad

The Golden Hawks opened the tournament with a 4-3 loss to St. Francis Xavier X-Women Thursday.

In that game, Crago scored a goal for the Golden Hawks.

Facing the University of Manitoba Bisons in their second game Friday, Knox backstopped the Golden Hawks to a 4-0 win.

However, a St. Francis Xavier win over the University of Manitoba Saturday relegated the Golden Hawks to the bronze-medal game.
