About 20 area employers are looking for help and will be at the yorkworks job fair April 5 accepting resumes.

There are openings for fulltime, part-time and seasonal positions in a number of industries, including the various trades, health care, early childhood education, customer service and telecommunications.

"We really have something for everybody," said Michelle Palmer, event specialist for yorkworks.

Some of the companies attending the job fair, which runs from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Lebovic Centre for Arts and Entertainment - Nineteen on the Park, are Aerotek, Circa Metals, Almac Industrial Systems and Vince's Market.

When it comes to specialized positions, "the rate of pay has not changed because of the economy, it's more the availability of the positions," Ms Palmer said, adding there are actually less of those job openings, espe-cially with Steelcase in Markham
