April is autism awareness month.

One in 150 people are diagnosed with autism and it is four times more likely for boys to be affected than girls.

Autism impairs a person's ability to communicate and relate to others. There are very mild to severe symptoms. Parents are encouraged to speak to a pediatrician at first signs of autism to begin early intervention.

On April 1, iconic structures around the world, including the Empire State Building in Manhattan and Toronto's CN Tower, will be illuminated in the colour blue to support autism awareness through the Light it up Blue campaign.
