COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS - APRIL 5, 2011

FARMERS' MARKET TO RELOCATE ONTO PARK DRIVE

Council enacted a by-law to facilitate a Temporary Street Closure of Park Drive, from south of Latham Hall through to the Burkholder Street / Booth Drive intersection, for each Thursday, from May 12, 2011 to October 6, 2011 inclusive, from 12 Noon to 8 p.m. to accommodate the operation of the Market

PROGRAM FUNDING

 Council authorized the 2011 agreement with the Region for subsidized recreation program funding for children and youth. Along with the subsidy for summer camp, this program has expanded to include PLAY (Positive Activities for Youth) for year round programming. The Region also funds 1:1 support for inclusion of those with special needs, to those who qualify.

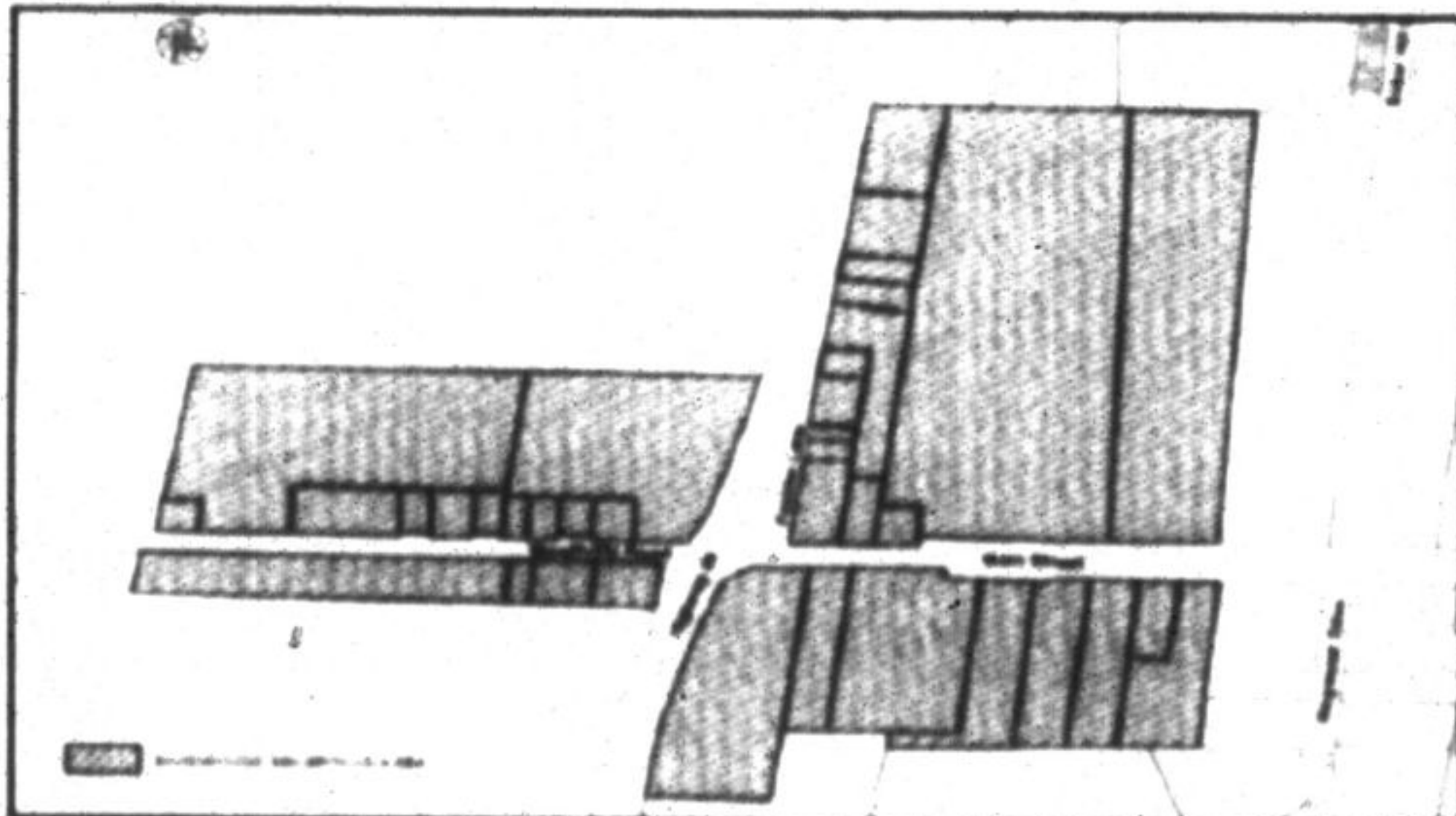

SWEEPING OF TOWN STREETS

The Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Works will soon be commencing the annual Spring Street Sweeping Program to clean all Town streets of sand deposited during winter control and other debris (weather permitting)

Spring street sweeping improves water quality and the environment by removing pollutants that can be transferred to downstream water bodies through urban runoff. The Street Sweeping Program also improves the cleanliness and aesthetics of Town streets and parking lots throughout the Town.

The sweeping operations are expected to be completed on or about May 20th, weather permitting. Major roads are swept first, followed by residential streets.

We encourage residents to clean sidewalks and boulevards by sweeping the excess winter sand to the curb or edge of road. To help us provide the best service possible, please do not push sand into piles on the road, as the sweeper cannot pick them up. When possible, please minimize residential street parking during this process to ensure best results.

The purpose of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005 (AODA) is to achieve accessibility for Ontarians with disabilities with respect to goods, services, facilities, accommodation, employment, buildings, structures and premises on or before January 1, 2025, by developing, implementing and enforcing accessibility standards. In 2001, The Ontarians with Disabilities Act (ODA) mandated that all municipalities prepare annual accessibility plans. To this end, the 2011 Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville Annual Accessibility Plan outlines barrier removal initiatives accomplished in 2010 and measures to be taken in 2011 to identify, remove and prevent barriers to people with disabilities.
