Accused in 2010 Gormley murder headed for trial

Paul Kenyon, who is charged with the second degree murder of Marion Deacon, is being sent to trial.

Following preliminary hearings in Newmarket court earlier this year, Justice Peter N. Bourque concluded there was enough evidence to send the case to the Superior Court of Justice.

No trial date has been set.

At about 8:20 a.m. March 7, 2010, York Regional Police, Whitchurch-Stouffville firefighters along with York Region Emergency Medical Services responded to a house fire at 6 Doner St. in Gormley.

Mr. Kenyon, who had been staying at Ms Deacon's home, was found outside the resi-

dence and conscious. He was transported to the hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

A mother of three daughters, Ms Deacon, 46, was found inside the home with no vital signs.

She was transported to the hospital where she was pronounced dead.

A post-mortem examination determined the cause of death to be multiple blunt force injuries to the head.

Break-in suspect caught on video

A suspect remains at large after breaking into the Canadian Tire store on Hoover Park Drive March 18.

The incident occurred around 2 a.m. when the suspect entered the store through a sliding glass door, which led to the garden centre facing Hwy. 48.
