Ouick start for SDSS track team

One meet doesn't constitute a season.

But based on how the Stouffville District Secondary School Spartans track and field team fared in its first competition of the season, the York Region Athletic Association indoor championships at York University Friday, head coach Steve Jimmo was pleased.

With 27 schools in attendance at the oneday event, the Spartans finished a respectable seventh overall after accumulating 92 points.

Bill Crothers of Unionville, an elite athletebased school, was first with 382.

"I thought we did all right," Jimmo said. "It's actually about where I thought we would end up."

This year's team has far more participants - a total of 52 -than last year.

There were no midget or junior boys competitors last year. This year's team features some starry youngsters.

One Grade 9 participant who made an immediate impact was Greg Barker, who won the midget boys' shot put with a schoolrecord toss of 13.67 metres.

"He's a big kid, six-foot, three-inches tall and he's strong and fast." Jimmo said of Barker, who played for the Spartans junior hockey team and in the GTHL this past season.

Transfer students, including Devante Smith from Pierre Elliott Trudeau in Markham, also helped. Smith was third in the junior boys' high jump event.

Other transfers included Andrew Harper and his younger brother Amar, who both came from Bur Oak in Markham.

Andrew finished sixth in the senior boys' triple jump while Amar was sixth in the junior boys' triple jump.

The Spartans also received several noteworthy performances from their returning cast.

In the senior division, Olivia Bolender competed in three events and was second in the girls' triple jump and fourth in the long jump and high jump.

Michael Bourgeois ran his way to a second-place finish in the 800m and third in the 1,500m. Also in the senior division, Adam Irwin was ninth in the boys' shot put.

Emily Clarkson was sixth in the girls shot put and Demi Chalkias 10th. Annilika Schulz was ninth in the girls' 60m low hurdles.

In the junior bracket, Josephine Lipari was sixth in the girls' 1,500m. Titi Odunlami was ninth in the girls' triple jump.

In the midget girls' division, Laura Monk was fifth in the shot put while Genevieve Pizzale was seventh and Colleen Welch eighth.

In the triple jump, Erin Dobson was sixth and Welsh 12th. Sarah Schouten was eighth in the girls' 60m.

Among midget boys, Michael Addante was 12th in the shot put.

In relay events, the midget girls 4 x 200 B entry was fourth and A entry sixth. The midget boys' 4 x 200m A entry was fifth. The senior boys finished 11th in the 4 x 200m event.

To prep for outdoor championships at York University May 16, the Spartans will take part in a meet at Crothers April 26 and the Sacred Heart Classic in Etobicoke May 6.




