Now that the snow has melted, what lies on the ground is a lot of garbage.

But you can help clean it up during Whitchurch-Stouffville's fifth annual Earth Day celebration next Saturday.

"We have to start paying attention to our environment and surroundings," said Micole Ongman, manager of recreation for the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville. "This is where we live. We should keep it nice and clean."

The main cleanup is taking place at the Stouffville Reservoir on Millard Street just east of Ninth Line.
