

Pierson in tough with new fighter

After having one opponent drop out from his scheduled UFC 129 fight earlier this month, Sean Pierson has a new rival to face at the Rogers Centre in Toronto next Saturday.

And it's one the 35-year-old Stouffville resident and welterweight mixed martial arts fighter holds with great respect.

Jake Ellenberger, a 26-yearold resident of Omaha, Neb., is six-foot, 170-pounds. He enters the sold-out card with a 24-5-0 mark.

Pierson, who is the same size and sports an 11-4-0 record, predicted Ellenberger will present a far greater challenge than Brian Foster, 27, who was forced out of the card after being diagnosed he had a brain hemorrhage during an Ontario Athletics Commission-mandated MRI that is part of a pre-fight medical.

"He's a good opponent and dangerous." Pierson said of Ellenberger. "He has far more experience than what Brian (Foster) had.

"Jake (Ellenberger) is a top-20 fighter in the world. To fight Jake is a huge step up for me. If I can win it would vault me up in the rankings."

Pierson said the key will be who can control the fight.

"He's good at going the distance and I'll have to try to counteract that," Pierson said.
