

Room rented multiple times: police

A Whitechurch-Stouffville man has been charged with fraud under \$5,000 after a room was rented to more than one tenant, York Regional Police said.

The victim responded to an online classified ad for a house rental in the Stouffville area.

The complainant visited the property in January and allegedly entered into an agreement to begin April 1, which included making a deposit.

Further attempts to contact the land-

lord/owner were futile and the complainant eventually learned there were other residents in the property who leased a room in January.

The complainant made further attempts to get the deposit back, but was unsuccessful.

The charge of fraud under \$5,000 stems from the allegation the suspect entered into a contract for the sole purpose of obtaining money from the complainant under false pretenses.

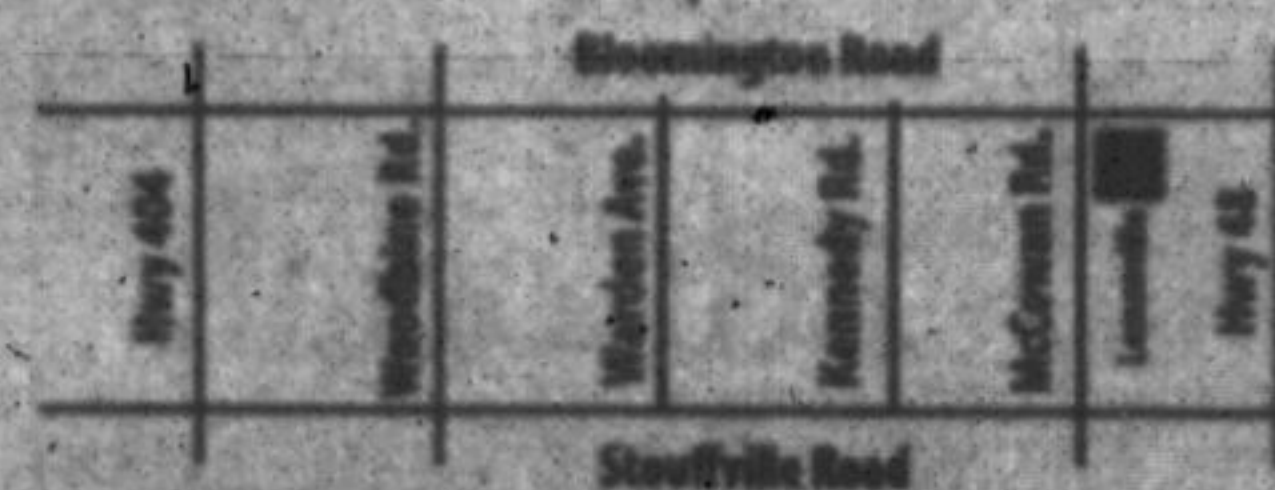

FROM THE DESK OF THE FIRE CHIEF:

Spring is here and with it comes warmer temperatures and the greater risk of brush or grass fires. Remember that you need a permit to open air burn. Always follow the rules set out in your permit. Watch for weather conditions, have adequate water on hand and never leave a fire burning unattended.
