Water filtration firm denies representing town

Some Whitchurch-Stouffville residents claim a water filtration company is representing the town and telling them their drinking water has high levels of chlorine in it.

But both the director of public works for the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville and

the founder of the company in question, Greenlife Water filtration systems, say this is not so.

"Absolutely not. We don't represent the town," said Daniel MacDonald, founder of Greenlife. "We have strict guidelines on what the agent can say. ... We're not making that claim."

The town - and The Sun-Tribune - have received calls

from residents of Stouffville as recently as last week concerning people coming to their door to discuss the town's water quality, according to Paul Whitehouse, the municipality's director of public works.

Mr. Whitehouse said if anyone has questions about their water, they should call the town immediately and tell the soliciting agent "no thank you".

"It is safe," Mr. Whitehouse said of the town's water.

In terms of showing up unannounced, that is not how the municipality operates.

"The town makes appointments with people and sends people who are uniformed," he said. "They just don't go door to door."

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO

York Regional Police's fraud unit said it has not received any formal complaints but does offer advice to homeowners.

"When people come to your door, don't be intimidated to buy something because they're there," said spokesperson Const. Blair McQuillan.

He also noted, just as having your roof repaired, you should get more than one quote. So when it comes to water systems "don't just rely on one person".


