# Werek caught off guard with deal to desert

One day a New York Ranger, next day a member of the Phoenix Coyotes.

In the case of Ethan Werek, that was the scenario he found himself in Sunday when the Coyotes acquired him in a trade from the Rangers.

In exchange, the Coyotes dealt Swedish centre Oscar Lindberg, a 19-year-old who was their second-round pick in the 2010 National Hockey League entry draft, to the Rangers.

Werek was a second-round pick, 47th overall, by the Rangers in the 2009 draft. The 19-year-old former Stouffville Spirit star and Goodwood resident was initially blind-sided by the transaction.

"It was definitely a surprise, I was caught off guard," said Werek, a six-foot, two-inch, 200-pound centre who played the last three seasons with the Kingston Frontenacs of the Ontario Hockey League.

"The first thing (Maloney) said to me was that they were glad to have me," Werek said.

Werek hadn't signed a contract with the Rangers since being drafted, but he did not think that factored into him being dealt. If he remained unsigned through next month, he would be thrown back into the pool for this year's draft in Minnesota June 24 and 25.

Maloney said the Coyotes intend to send him a contract offer sheet later this week.


As for leaving the Rangers organization,

> Werek is unlikely to return to junior as an overager next season but could play for Phoenix's top farm team, the San Antonio Rampage of the American Hockey League, if he fails to crack the Coyotes lineup.

Launching his minor hockey career in the Whitchurch-Stouffville Minor Hockey Association, Werek had 24 goals and 28 assists in 47 regular-season games and three assists in three playoff games last season with the Frontenacs.

Werek played the 2007-08 season with the Spirit, which is partially owned by his father Zeev Werek, and amassed 29 goals and 41 assists in 37 regular season contests.
