He joined the Empowered Student Partnership group at his school and pitched the idea for his Stomp Out Poverty shoe drive in Stouffville.


Teacher Efy Geronikolos and the small group of students jumped on board.

Banned vendor returning to market

Barry's Gardens Farm Market will be allowed to sell its produce at the Downtown Stouffville Farmers' Market starting today.

But the rules that govern the market, including what you can buy there, are under review.

The decision was made unani-

mously by council Tuesday afternoon, which overturned the farmers market committee's decision to deny Barry's Gardens' application this season.

Councillor Rob Hargrave was absent from the meeting and did not vote.

"I'm very happy. It was what I was hoping for," said David Barry,

in a telephone interview from the Bethesda Road farm, adding he will be selling produce at the market today.

The committee denied Mr. Barry's application to be a vendor at this year's farmers market because he did not follow the rules. He had been a vendor since 2009 when the market opened.

"The bylaw for the market is that all farmers need to grow 70 per cent of the products they sell and Dave doesn't grow any of them from my knowledge," Paul Brooks, owner/operator of Mount Albert's Brooks Farms, said earlier this week.
