Spirit expects Caggiula back in town

For the second spring in a row, Drake Caggiula has been drafted.

Last year the Pickering resident was a third-round pick of the Ontario Hockey League's Erie Otters before going on to play his first season of junior hockey with the Stouffville Spirit of the Ontario Junior Hockey League.

This time around, the five-foot-ten forward was chosen in the sixth round of the United States Hockey League entry draft by the Des Moines Buccaneers, who finished seventh out of eighth teams in the Western Conference this past season.

Caggiula was one of two Canadians - the other being defenceman Callum Hofford - drafted by Des Moines.

Being picked up by the Buccaneers opens another door for Caggiula, who finished fifth in Spirit scoring last season with 22 goals and 45 points.

He could opt to join the club next season and perhaps pursue an NCAA scholarship, give making the Otters' roster another shot or spend another season with the Spirit.

Spirit general manager Kenny Burrows said Tuesday he has spoken to Caggiula and expects him back in Stouffville this fall.

Record-breaking Spartans qualify for Central meet

Greg Barker highlighted a contingent of competitors from the Stouffville District Secondary School Spartans who took to the York University track Monday and Tuesday.

Each of them won one event by setting a meet record and earned two other topthree placings at the York Region Athletic Association outdoor track and field championships.

Barker, a Grade 9 student, captured the midget boys' discus event and set a YRAA and school record with a toss of 42.39 metres.

The prior mark was held by Kevin Wyszatko of Dr. J.M. Denison (Newmarket) in 2009 with a heave of 41.09m.

Barker also finished second in the javelin and third in shot put.

Also in the boys' field, Michael Bourgeois was first to cross the finish line in the open boys' 2,000m steeplechase in a time of 6:26.09.

He was also fifth in the senior boys' 3,000 m.

Among girls, Emily Clarkson also earned three top-three placings after winning the senior girls' discus with a school record toss of 28.16m.

She was also second in the javelin and third in shot put.

Olivia Bolender, another senior competitor, won the girls' high jump with a leap of 1.40m and was second in triple jump and fifth long jump.

Laura Monk, a Grade 9 student, won the midget girls' discus with a throw of 21.48m and was fifth in the javelin.

Barker, a Grade 9 student, captured the midget boys' discus event and set a YRAA and school record with a toss of 42.39 metres.

Other notable performances came from Rose Wideman, who was third in the midget girls' 100m, Ashley Johnston fifth senior girls' discus, Emily Goodwin fifth midget girls' 100m and Erin Dobson fifth midget girls' triple jump.

They will all advance to the Central Regionals, which will take place at York University May 26 and 27.


In the overall team standings, the Spartans were 10th with 123 points.






