## Homeowner uncovers history lesson on Main St.

For years, Paul Clubbe walked by 6060 Main St. and admired its beauty.

And every spring, like clockwork, a for sale sign would go up on the front lawn and every summer the sign would come down.

Out of curiosity in 2004, Mr. Clubbe, owner of Paul Clubbe Marketing Ltd., decided to contact a local real estate agent about the property east of Ninth Line.

It had just been listed again by the owners but no sign had gone up. Mr. Clubbe and the owners reached a deal and the 1885 two-storey 4,500-square-foot home became his company's new office.

Before that, the manufacturer of audio visual presentation products spent about five years renting an office on Edward Street.

He said the home, which is one of the oldest buildings in Stouffville and was built for Nelson Patterson, a veterinarian, had been turned into two apartments that were not maintained. So they ripped out the carpet, re-did the original pine floors and painted and upgraded

the electrical system. They also added two furnaces, central air conditioning and central vacuum.

When it came to the exterior,
Mr. Clubbe wanted to restore it
back to the way it originally looked.
