No mercy for Mennos on road

Like the Toronto Blue Jays this week, the Stouffville Mennos had a tough time generating any offence against the Scarborough Athletics in their Oshawa City and District Fastball League contest in Scarborough Tuesday.

In fact, the Mennos collected just one hit in a 7-0 mercy-shortened loss to the Athletics.

A single by Faisal Hassan in the sixth inning prevented Athletics' starting pitcher Andy Skelton from tossing a no-hitter.

A senior pitcher with Owen Sound when not pitching for the Athletics, Skelton fanned 11 Mennos' batters and surrendered just one walk to Jeff Boadway in the fifth that spoiled a perfect game bid to earn the win.

A sign of things to come for the Mennos came in the Athletics' first trip to the plate when they capitalized on two infield errors and a questionable call from the umpires to score a pair of runs.

Skelton helped his own cause in the third inning when he belted a two-run homer to give the Athletics a 4-0 lead.

The Athletics added two more runs in the fourth inning and one in the sixth before the game was called.

Greg Dalgarno handled starting pitching duties for the Mennos and was replaced by Travis Connor in the third inning after being tossed from the game by the plate umpire for questioning balls and strikes.

Dalgarno, who took the loss, and Con-

nor gave up nine hits while striking out four batters.

Now 3-6 on the season, the Mennos are scheduled to host the Oshawa Rebels tonight at Stouffville Memorial Park at 8:30 p.m.

Sear sixth in CJGA event at Maples

Ben Sear finished in a two-way tie in his age group division in sixth place at the Canadian Junior Golf Association's US Kids Teen World Golf Championship East Qualifier at the Maples of Ballantrae Golf Club Sunday.
