Comedians looking for laughs at 19 on Park

"Living in a cold country, you've got to have a sense of humour," said Morgan Flood, producer of the ALTdot Comedy Lounge tour.

The show stops at the Lebovic Centre for Arts and Entertainment - Nineteen on the Park July 21. It kicks off the theatre's live comedy series.

Alternative comedy, which is what ALTdot is primarily known for, is more than a set-up followed by a punch line.

It includes sketch comedy, improv, performance art or a monologue. It's also an opportunity for comedians to test out new material.

ALTdot Comedy is based in the backroom of Queen Street's Rivoli and has played host to Kids in the Hall, Barenaked Ladies as well as Corky

and the Juice Pigs before they made it big.

But producers did not want to keep all of this talent to themselves, which is why they have taken the show on the road.

The Stouffville show will feature about seven comedians, including the obscure Winston Spear.

Perry Perlmutar is also on the bill. His experiences as an ESL teacher and marriage to a Muslim woman – he's Jewish – provide much of his material.

Also scheduled to appear are Canadian Comedy Award winners Mark DeBonis and Ron Sparks, XM Satellite Radio's Next Top Comic winner Matt O'Brien and best stand-up newcomer nominee at this year's Canadian Comedy Awards, DJ Demers.

"(Every comedian) may not be your cup of tea, but overall, you had a great show," Mr. Flood said.


Tickets are \$20 and restricted to people 18 years and older. Show-time is 8 p.m.
