# Cornacchia out as Waxers GM/Coach

Vandorf-area resident Joe Cornacchia was relieved of his duties as Markham Waxers junior A hockey club general manager and head coach Wednesday.

Chris Vanstone, who was associate general manager of the Oakville Blades for the last four seasons, was named to replace Cornacchia as the Waxers' general manager by club owner Bruce Jackson.

Vanstone announced yesterday he had hired ex-Oakville and Burlington Jr. A coach Mark Jorris to coach the Waxers.

Cornacchia had served with the Waxers for the last seven years as general manager. During the last three years he also handled the head coaching duties when his brother Rick accepted a position to coach the Italian men's team.

Cornacchia is the former president of the Whitchurch-Stouffville Minor Hockey Association and was briefly with the Stouffville Spirit Jr. A team in 2005.

The Waxers were eliminated by the Spirit in the 2011 Ontario Junior Hockey League playoffs.

Cornacchia declined to comment when contacted by the York Region Media Group.

The Waxers open training camp this morning at Markham Centennial arena.

## Mennos swept in season-ending series

The Stouffville Mennos were hoping to conclude their Oshawa City and District Fastball League regular season schedule on a positive note against Aurora Shoeless Joe's in Memorial Park Thursday.

Aurora spoiled the Mennos' plans in a big way by pummeling the hosts 9-1.

Aurora jumped on Mennos' starting pitcher Travis Connor in the first inning by scoring three unearned runs.

Connor went two more innings and gave up three more runs before giving way to reliever Bruce Cringan. Cringan struggled to find the plate on occasion, but held Aurora from ending the game early on the mercy rule.

The Mennos scored their lone run in the fourth inning when catcher Robert Kay singled and scored on a double by Byron Baranieski, who played first base.

Baranieski had two hits for the Mennos off winning pitcher Todd Martin, who gave up just

three hits in the game while striking out 11 batters in six innings.

Ken O'Sullivan tossed the final inning for Aurora.

Offensively, Aurora shortstop and Whitchurch-Stouffville resident Nick Dambrosio swung a hot bat as he had two triples and two singles, while fellow Whitchurch-Stouffville resident Evan Boyd and O'Sullivan each had two hits.

The two clubs played in Aurora Wednesday with the Mennos battling Aurora right down to the wire before falling 6-5.

Capitalizing on an interference call to their lead-off batter in the first inning enabled Aurora to score three runs.

The Mennos answered back with one run in the third inning and three in the fourth to take a short-lived 4-3 lead.

Faisal Hassan drove in one run with a double and Cringan followed with another double to score two runs.

Aurora scored one run in the bottom of the fourth to even the score at 4-4.

The Mennos took a 5-4 lead in the top of the seventh inning on a bunt single by Rich Burkholder and a triple by Dale Boadway.

But it was not enough as Aurora scored two runs on three hits in the bottom of the seventh inning for the win.

Mennos starter Jay Nesbitt took the loss with Connor coming on in relief in the last inning.

Concluding the regular season with a 9-12 mark, the Mennos are scheduled to begin playoffs during the week of Aug. 22. As of press time, they did not know where they finished or who their opponent will be.

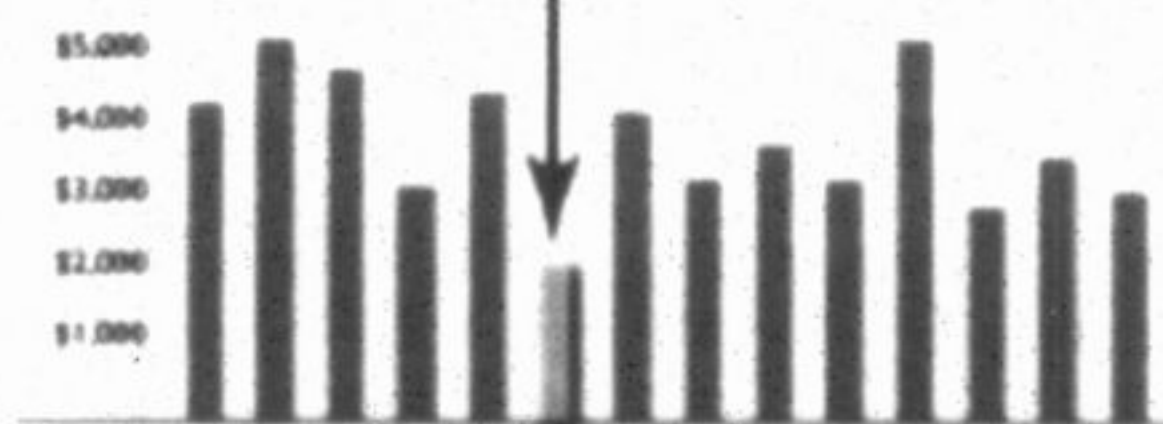
