Show judge Luther Brown is the choreographer, Ms Leuschner said, adding fellow York Region dancers and show competitors Shane Simpson and Melissa Mitro are also going.

Tottenham resident Jordan Clark won the competition. She received a new car and \$100,000 in cash.

Having the show end is bittersweet for Ms Leuschner.

"I'm happy because my body is tired. My brain is tired. It's good to have a rest," she said.

Unbeknownst to the competitors, Sunday's season finale also marked the end of the series. After four seasons, the show was cancelled Tuesday.

Although no reasons were noted, the show had high production costs with auditions across the country and live performances.

Despite Ms Leuschner not winning, "I'm really fortunate to have made it all the way to the end," she said.


In doing so, she also pocketed \$5,000, which Ms Leuschner said she is going to invest back into her dancing.
