Downtown food store welcomed

A grocery store is coming to downtown Stouffville.

Town council last week granted the owner of 6280 Main St., Dario Valente, permission to place construction hoarding on Main Street to renovate the building's front facade.

"I'm going to do whatever we can to open stores down there," said Councillor Richard Bartley during Tuesday afternoon's council meeting. "People have been asking, since the IGA left, for a grocery store."

Mr. Valente told The Sun-Tribune he did not want to provide details regarding the type of grocery store he wants to open because plans are still in the development stage.

Mr. Valente, who owns and operates Apart ments International, a short-term rental agency of furnished apartments within the GTA, bought 6280 Main St. and its adjoining home at 6282 Main St. about four years ago.

Last November, Mr. Valente received a \$14,387.50 loan from the municipality to repair the building's roof, through its downtown improvement program.

"The roof is most important. If you don't have a roof, you don't have a house." Mr. Valente told The Sun-Tribune. "We're very grateful for the support of the town."


Construction on the facade of the building, the former home of WhiStle Radio, is not expected to start until well into October. according to Andrew McNeely, director of planning and building services for the town.







