WATER BILLS DUE DATE - OCTOBER 7, 2011

WATER bills have now been mailed. Failure to receive a water bill does not eliminate the responsibility for payment of water or the penalty charge for late payment. If you have not received your water bill, contact the Finance Department as soon as possible.

PAYMENTS may be made by mail, at most Financial Institutions, banking machines, by telephone and internet or in person at the Municipal Offices at 111 Sandiford Drive. After hours, water payments may be made in the drop box at the main entrance of the Municipal Offices (111 Sandiford Drive).

PLEASE NOTE: The Town will no longer accept credit cards for payment of your water accounts.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

All yard waste material except brush must be placed in paper yard waste bags or an open top container (excluding cardboard boxes). Clear, opaque or orange bags will not be collected.

Yard Waste is collected bi-weekly on your regular collection day from April to November. Please refer to the collection schedule for the yard waste collection days for your area.

A copy of the schedule can be obtained from www.townofws.ca

Materials acceptable for collection include leaves, plants, fine brush, tree clippings, branches.

Branches are not to exceed 100 mm (four inches) in diameter, and shall be tied in bundles of a maximum length of 12 metres (four feet), and weighing no more than 22 kgs (fifty pounds).

Please do not use wire to tie bundles.

Materials not accepted include grass clippings, stumps, root balls, rocks, food and kitchen wastes, animal droppings, fruit and vegetables, driveway and road sweepings.

Residents who wish to drop off their yard waste (including grass clippings) may do so, free of charge, at the Miller Waste Composting Facility, 1351 Bloomington Road, Richmond Hill (just west of Leslie Street) Monday to Saturday – 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (closed Statutory Holidays).

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

HAWTHORN AVENUE RECONSTRUCTION

The Hawthorn Avenue Reconstruction project is nearing completion for 2011. The Contractor, Esposito Bros. Construction Ltd., has completed most of the sanitary sewer, storm sewer and watermain construction, and over the next 6-8 weeks, subject to favourable weather conditions, we expect to complete:

- · additional repairs to the sanitary sewer using trenchless methods;
- · construction of new curbs and sidewalk;
- paving of base-course asphalt and driveways; and
- · fine-grading and placement of sod.

RUPERT AVENUE RECONSTRUCTION

The Rupert Avenue Reconstruction project is also nearing completion. The Contractor has completed most of the underground repairs and water system improvements, the curb and sidewalk replacements, and construction of the granular road base for both Rupert Ave and Palmwood Gate. Over the next 2-4 weeks, subject to favourable weather conditions, we expect to complete:

- additional repairs to sanitary sewer and storm sewer maintenance holes;
- · paving of base-course asphalt and driveway aprons;
- · fine-grading and placement of sod

PINE STREET RECONSTRUCTION

The Pine Street Reconstruction project is about to begin. It is intended that the Rupert Avenue project be essentially complete before commencing Pine street in order to minimize disruption to the neighbourhoods. The construction schedule is a few weeks behind as the Contractor experienced some challenges on the other streets in the contract (Rupert Ave and Hawthorn Ave) but over the next 5-8 weeks, subject to favourable weather conditions, we expect to complete:

- construction of a new watermain link to Thicketwood Boulevard
- · repair of the sanitary sewer using trenchless methods;
- · construction of new curb, using the heritage design concept.
- · paving of base-course asphalt and driveway aprons; and
- fine-grading and placement of sod.

The top layer of asphalt paving is planned for completion in 2012 or 2013, to coordinate with other paving projects

Please consider alternate routes. If you do travel through a construction area, please drive slowly and exercise caution.




