

WE ASKED: WHAT ARE THE TWO MOST PRESSING ISSUES FACING OAK RIDGES-MARKHAM AND WHAT ARE YOUR SOLUTIONS?

I often hear about traffic congestion from my constituents.

Gridlock is not only happening on the highways that commuters use, but also or our local municipal roads.

My riding now contains five GO train stations - more than any other electoral district in Ontario - and we will be adding another extending the Richmond Hill line to Gormley by 2013. We've made major improvements to Highways 400 and 27 in King and Hwy. 404 is currently being repaved between Stouffville Rd and Bloomington.

With the riding's rapid growth in population it is essential that I continue to work with our government and the various transit agencies to ensure that Oak Ridges-Markham is a priority when it comes to transit and infrastructure funding, in turn helping to reduce commute times and improve overall quality of life for my constituents.

The two most pressing issues facing Oak Ridges-Markham are increased cost of living expenses and the need for business and infrastructure development in this riding.

In the past eight years under Dalton McGuinty, the government has nearly quadrupled in size, which has increased administrative costs. There are now more than 80,000 bureaucrats who are paid more than \$100,000 per year.

There have been a number of tax increases. the introduction of new taxes and soaring hydro rates because of failed energy experi-
