Ball player, 73, off to Utah

Bryan Emery had no intentions of participating in the slo-pitch tournament during the Huntsman World Seniors Games in St. George, Utah, starting Monday.

But after the 73-year-old Whitchurch-Stouffville resident fielded a telephone call this past summer asking if he would be interested in going to the games, he's getting his glove and bat ready.

Emery, a retired George Brown College mechanical engineering teacher, will play shortstop for the Mississauga Legends in the 70-and-over division.

"Someone from London called me up, I guess (Mississauga) heard about me and said to me 'I hear you play shortstop and we're looking for one'," Emery said.

The team first wanted to see what he could do on the ball diamond.

Emery plays for a Markham entry in the Markham Oldtimers Recreational Slo-Pitch League as a means of keeping active. He was a competitive fastball player, including a stint with the senior 'B' Oshawa Merchants and winning

an Ontario championship with Stouffville Betz Pools as a player-coach. Emery had no qualms about their request and took to the diamond with them for a one-day tryout in Milton in early August.

INTERNATIONAL VETERAN

After watching Emery's fielding abilities and in swinging a bat, the Legends welcomed him to their team.

As a tuneup for their trip, they participated in a tournament in Keswick where they won two of three games to finish in second place in the 60-and-over division.

During the 1960s, Emery ran against the likes of former Canadian Olympic 800 metre silver medallist and Markham resident Bill Crothers in the 400 and 800m.

He was also once one of Canada's top trampolinists, competing at world meets in Portugal and New Zealand.

As for how the Legends will fare at the games, Emery has no idea.

Especially since he was informed some 50 North American entries are expected to be participating.

"It should be interesting, I'm looking forward to going," he said.
