Accident victim loved his work

Kyle Knox, 24, died on job at York U subway

Kyle Knox had a passion for construction, fishing, hunting and snowcross racing.

The 24-year-old Musselman's Lake resident died Tuesday when a drilling rig toppled onto two smaller machines at York University.

Mr. Knox was caught in one of the smaller machines.

He would have turned 25 Nov. 12.

The accident happened at 2:40 p.m. at the future site of the new TTC subway station, next to the Schulich School of Business.

"He was my best friend," said his sister, Kendall, 23. "Everything he did, I did."

That includes playing hockey, which is how Mr. Knox met his longtime girlfriend Nicole Love.

Mr. Knox is also survived by his parents, Sherry and Kent,
