

Crime briefs from around town

Police probe third break-in

A third home in Stouffville has been broken into, rifled through and had a quantity of jewelry stolen from it.

The incident took place Oct. 26 on Reeves Way Boulevard.

Two other homes, one on Clamerten Road, the other on Sandiford Drive, had their front doors kicked in and quantities of jewelry stolen Oct. 20.

No supect(s) description is available at this time for any of these break and enters.

"We have property crime investigators and crime analysts that look at patterns and try to determine if any incidents are connected but for investigative purposes, we can't reveal this to the public," said Const. Rebecca Boyd, a spokesperson for York Regional Police.

Officers called to dine and dash

A pizza delivery man had to call York Regional Police in order to get paid.

On Oct. 29 at about 2 a.m. the suspects ordered a party pizza, lasagna, two salads and a sandwich, to be delivered to an address on Hwy. 48.

Once the driver arrived and handed over the food, the two suspects ran into a wooded area with the food and without making payment.

Officers tracked a suspect down, using the telephone number the pizza was ordered from.

Shortly thereafter, the outstanding balance of the food had been settled, according to York

However, the officers were unable to recover the actual food.

Woman bilked in online ticket scam

A single Stouffville mother is out \$400 after trying to buy four Selena Gomez concert tickets online.

On Oct. 20, the complainant answered an online ad for the Oct. 25 concert tickets in Oshawa.

The woman sent the money through an e-mail transfer and it was agreed the suspect would FedEx the tickets, according to York Regional Police.

The tickets never arrived. The suspect used a false FedEx confirmation number when making the arrangements, according to York Regional Police.

"Members of the public are reminded to exercise caution when using the Internet. social media and online classifieds. Never give out personal information including name, address and telephone number without knowing specifically with whom you're speaking," said Const. Boyd.


