York housing market hot

The real estate market was booming in October with GTA-wide sales up 17.5 per cent compared to last year.

More than 1,400 York Region homes changed hands last month, bringing the year-to-date total to just less than 15,000.

The numbers bode well for a strong finish to a year that started with more demand than supply, Toronto Real Estate Board president Richard Silver said.


"Homebuyers who found it diffi-

cult to make a deal in the spring and summer due to a shortage of listings have benefitted from increased supply in the fall," he said.

Average sales prices across the GTA were also up 8 per cent.

The average price of a home sold in York Region last month was \$548,813.

"Sellers" market conditions remain in place in many parts of the GTA. The result has been aboveaverage annual rates of price growth for most home types," board senior market analysis manager Jason Mercer said.
