Trio put Stouffville hockey skills to use in GTHL

Jackson Savery, Justin Bennett and Michael Palladino had nothing against playing their minor hockey in Whitchurch-Stouffville.

Without what the 13-year-old Stouffville residents learned while nurturing their skills in the Whitchurch-Stouffville Minor Hockey Association, they definitely wouldn't be where they are right now.




