

**Take precautions during hunting season**

There is nothing quite like hiking through the forest, hearing and feeling the crunch of the fallen autumn leaves under your feet.

But there are more than tree roots for which people have to watch out.

It is hunting season for a variety of species. A controlled shotgun hunt for whitetail deer ended Friday. Another controlled hunt runs from Dec. 5 to 9; according to Wil Wegman from the Ministry of Natural Resources, Aurora district.

"Hunting is allowed on most Crown land, on private property with the permission of the property owner and in some municipal forests. Anyone using the forest should check with the municipality for specific information," an MNR fact sheet states.

Hunting is only allowed in the Georgina tracts of Pepperlaw, Cronsberry and Metro Road, according to the Region of York.

There are precautions hikers, bird watchers and horseback riders can take, which include being aware of hunting season, wearing an orange vest/jacket/hat and being careful at dawn and dusk when red and green

colours can appear brown, according to the MNR fact sheet.

Avoid wearing white, especially mittens and hats, as they can resemble a deer tail through the trees. When it comes to dogs and horses, ensure they are wearing something brightly coloured such as a dog vest or horse rump sheet.

"Hunters must never shoot unless they are absolutely sure of their target and what is beyond it," according to the fact sheet.
