### PC MPPs hope to end YRT strike

York Region's three Progressive Conservative MPPs are tabling legislation to get public transit deemed an essential service and

'The bottom line is people would be back on the buses and they'd be rolling," said Thornhill

MPP Peter Shurman, who presented the bill at Queen's Park yesterday, sponsored by Newmarket-Aurora MPP Frank Klees and York-Simone MPP Julia Munro

Simcoe MPP Julia Munro.

The bill is to be debated today.

The three MPPs were disappointed by a terse reply when they asked the government to table its own legislation two weeks ago, when the legislature was not in session.

"In the face of government inaction ... we've got to do something, otherwise, this thing won't be just a protracted strike, but we won't have transit service in York Region for a long time," Mr. Shurman said. "After five weeks, enough is enough."


The urgency is increasing as the strike goes on, Mr. Klees said.

"We're optimistic, at least, that the government will recognize how important this is," he said, noting Premier Dalton McGuinty promised in Tuesday's throne speech to work with the other parties in the best interests of Ontarians.
