Singer's shows and recordings aimed at all ages

It's been two years since Bryan Moyer Suderman performed a concert in Stouffville.

In 2009, the show was at the Lebovic Centre for Arts and Entertainment - Nineteen on the Park to launch his fourth CD, *A New Heart*.

This Saturday, Mr. Moyer Suderman will perform at the Parkview Village auditorium to celebrate the release of his latest CD, *Detective of Divinity: Songs of Faith for Small and Tall*.

The album's name, as well as that of his record label, SmallTall Music, comes from Mr. Moyer Suderman's belief there should be no separation in music for children and adults.

The CD is a bit of a departure for Mr. Moyer Suderman. It is largely acoustic, with some bluegrass and folk guitar mixed in.

Although the Stouffville resident tours solo, he records with other musicians.

This time, he enlisted not only Allan Reesor-McDowell, as he has in the past, but also some students from Willowgrove Primary School and parishioners from the

During Saturday's show, Mr. Moyer Suderman will be joined by Mr. Reesor-McDowell and multi-instrumentalist Darrin Schott, as well as other special guests.

"My performances are very interactive, not just singing for people," he said.

The concert takes place at Parkview Village auditorium, 12184 Ninth Line. It starts at 7 p.m. Tickets are \$10 each or \$25 per family and are available at the door.
