Bruton was hired by the Bermuda Golf Association and the Bermuda Professional Golf Association to serve as a consultant to their long-term player development.



It will be a busy time," Brunton said.


Despite what is expected to be a full schedule, Brunton is looking forward to the challenge and anticipates it should be a fun venture.


