In a Boston newspaper, Parker said Trivino had run afoul of the team in the past.

The longtime coach said he sat down with his star player and warned him in September that he was down to his last chance with the team.

Trivino is the third hockey player with a Stouffville connection to face arrest in the United States in the past three years.


In November 2009, Stouffville resident Bobby Hughes, then 21, was with the Albany River Rats, an American Hockey League affiliate of the New York Islanders, when he was arrested by the U.S. Marshall violent crime fugitive task force following a road game in Bridgeport, Ct.

Hughes was arrested on a warrant issued in Bethlehem, N.Y. on charges of first-degree criminal sexual act and third-degree criminal sexual act.

A former fourth-round draft pick of the Carolina Hurricanes in 2006, Hughes, 24, was acquitted in June 2010.

He was able to resume his hockey career and plays and coaches in Germany for EHC 80 Numberg of the Bayernliga.

In September 2009, Patrick McEachen, a former defenceman with the Spirit in 2007-08 and 2008-09 who attended Clarkson University, was one of three players charged by New York State police with sexual misconduct while working at the school's summer hockey

camp in July of that year.

At the time, McEachen was 18 years old and an incoming freshman at the Potsdam, N.Y. school.

He pleaded guilty to a charge of disorderly conduct and was ordered to serve 200 hours of community service and could not return to Clarkson University.

Now 20, McEachen returned to Ontario where he played with the Wellington Dukes in the 2009-10 campaign and then split time with the Mississauga-St. Michael's Majors of the OHL and Queen's University.
