

## NOTICE OF PUBLIC CONSULTATION CENTRE

## ADDENDUM TO CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT St. John's Sideroad from Bayview Avenue to Woodbine Avenue Town of Aurora and Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville

The Regional Municipality of York (the Region) completed a Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) Study in 1999 for St. John's Sideroad between Yonge Street and Woodbine Avenue. This study recommended widening St. John's Sideroad from two to four lanes between Yonge Street and Bayview Avenue and making improvements between Bayview Avenue and Woodbine Avenue. Road widening between Yonge Street and Bayview Avenue was completed in 2006.



The Region is undertaking an addendum to the Class EA Study to determine the need for additional improvements to St. John's Sideroad between Bayview Avenue and Woodbine Avenue as part of the reconstruction of St. John's Sideroad in 2014. The Class EA Addendum is being conducted in accordance with Schedule Crequirements of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, as amended in 2007) which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

As part of the Class EA process, the Region is hosting a Public Consultation Centre (PCC) to answer questions and receive comments from residents and stakeholders.

The PCC will present information on:

- Current and future transportation characteristics of St. John's Sideroad between Bayview Avenue and Woodbine Avenue;
- Why transportation improvements are required at this corridor.
- Alternatives for improvements, including a preferred alternative
- Potential impacts the proposed improvements may have on the environment
- Next steps

Teenagers from Stouffville and Markham have been charged in the robbery of a taxi driver who was beaten and abandoned early Saturday in rural Uxbridge.

A canine team tracked down suspects, who fled after robbing the taxi driver of cash, cellphones and his car keys on Webb Road, Durham police said. The driver told cops he'd picked up three intoxicated teenagers at a Stouffville restaurant and dropped one off at a Concession 3 address before the robbery.

As he drove on Webb Road, the driver was told to pull over because one passenger was going to be sick, police said. At the side of the road, the two males clubbed the man with a pipe, robbed him and fled.

A canine team tracked suspects to a nearby home, where they were taken into custody. The driver was treated at hospital for his injuries.

Charged with robbery, assault and weapons offences are two 17-year-olds, one from Markham and the other from Stouffville.


