# Stronach pays \$14M for farm

Stouffville Rd. land zoned for agriculture

Frank Stronach's Adena Springs racing and breeding horse farm has purchased about 260 acres of land on Stouffville Road.

The property, in and around the Whitchurch-Stouffville community of Ringwood, sold for about \$14 million.

The land, which runs between Hwy. 48 and McCowan Road on the south side of Stouffville Road, will be used to grow hay for the operations racing and breeding horses, according to Mike Rogers, business manager for Adena Springs Canada.

The land is zoned for agriculture, according to the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville.

Aurora-based Adena Springs has been purchasing its hay but now "we're going to try and save money and do it ourselves," Mr. Rogers said. "We've been trying to acquire large chunks of land to give us hay for as long as we have horses."

The property, once owned by Hereford cattle breeder and Ringwood Farms owner George Rodanz, was not up for sale.
