York Region Media Group editorial, photography and design staff — including The Sun-Tribune's Sandra Bolan and Jim Mason — have won a record 51 international, national, provincial and newspaper industry awards.

The group's honours began with 16 awards from the Local Media Association, formerly the Suburban Newspapers of America, which represents more than 2,000 North American newspapers with a combined circulation of 22 million.

Five awards were earned from the Canadian Community Newspaper Association, while 14 prizes were awarded by the Ontario Community Newspaper Association.

The group, which publishes eight community newspapers in the region, also received 16 Metroland Media Awards of Editorial Excellence yesterday.




