

Baseball officially back in town next week

The Stouffville Yankees' select baseball program will make its long-awaited debut Wednesday at Memorial Park.

The Yankees' mosquito entry will take to the diamond for a game against Newmarket next week with the first pitch slated to be thrown at 6:45 p.m.

It's the first time baseball has been played in Stouffville in several years.

The opening festivities will begin at 6:30 p.m. Mayor Wayne Emmerson will be in attendance along with Glenn Jackson, a member of the 1958 Stouffville Cardinals.

Holly Barker will sing the national anthem.

Team 3 sixth in NASCAR opener

The Stouffville-based EHR Team 3 Red racing team opened the Canadian Tire NASCAR North Series with a sixth-place finish at the Vortex Brake Pads 200 event at the Canadian Tire Motorsports Park near Bowmanville Sunday.

With Jason Hathaway driving the Snap on Tools/Rockstar Energy Drink/Cortex Brake Pads Dodge on the renovated 2.5-mile road course, they qualified sixth among the 27-car field for the 51-lap race.

Through 18 laps, Hathaway occupied second place before a caution came out.

After a refuel and tire change, Hathaway re-entered the track in 12th spot and began to work his way towards the front.

By lap 30, he was ninth and eight laps later, moved up into seventh place.

On lap 47, Hathaway drove his way into sixth place and held onto that spot for the duration.

Despite not reaching the victory podium, Hathaway was pleased with the opening-race result.

"This was a great way to start the season off," Hathaway said. "The facility looks great and the crowd was like nothing we have seen at this track before ... The fans got to see a great race and we are pretty excited about our 2012 season."

J.R. Fitzpatrick took the checkered flag.

The next race in the series is scheduled to take place at the Circuit ICAR in Mirabel, Que. for the running of the Lucas Oil Grand Prix on another road course circuit June 2 and 3.

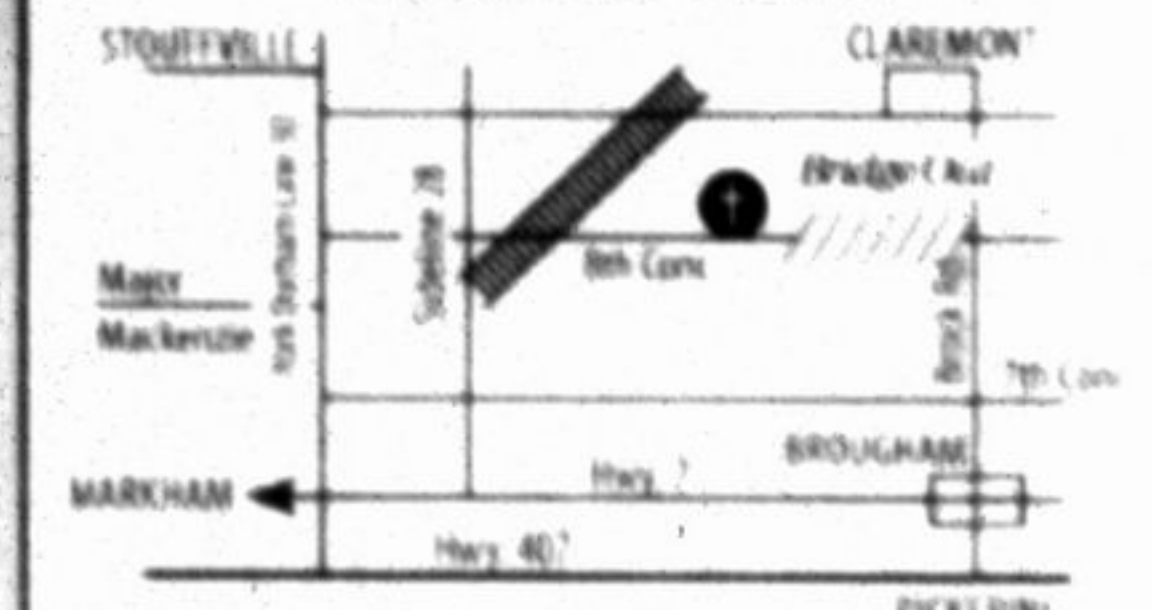
