A panel of judges determines who qualifies to compete at the CNE by reviewing DVD and You-Tube submissions submitted by last May.

The top three finalists will be awarded cash prizes, while the first-place winner will represent the CNE at the Canadian Youth Talent Competition in Winnipeg this fall.

A.J, a former York Region Media Group Celebration of the Arts bursary winner, has also received the annual Whitchurch-Stouffville Student Music Scholarship Concert award.




