

Scratch tickets yield \$100,000, \$50,000 prizes

Three local residents will be going on shopping sprees thanks to their lottery wins.

Edmond and Pauline Goulding recently won \$100,000 with an instant Lotto 6/49 scratch ticket.

"I'm excited and relieved," Mr. Goulding, 67, said when he claimed the prize.

Mr. Goulding bought the ticket in North York and his wife is the one who scratched the winning numbers.

Before telling her husband, with whom she's been playing the lottery for almost 15 years, she put the winning ticket into her purse and then verified it at the store's self-checker, according to an OLG media release.

"I did my happy dance," she said.

The couple plan on using their winnings to go on vacation, as well as buy a motor-

cycle for Mr. Goulding.

Eleni Hughes scratched 'offshore,' 'band,' 'know,' 'basic,' 'eel' and 'guide' to help her earn \$50,000 in the Instant Cross-word game.

Mr. Goulding bought the ticket in North York and his wife is the one who scratched the winning numbers.

"At first I thought I was wrong but after double checking my ticket, I felt my knees slowly start to buckle," she said in an OLG press release.

Ms Hughes said she plans on using the winnings to splurge on herself.

The plan is for the Conseil scolaire de district catholique Centre-Sud board to demolish the vacated Orchard Park school and construct a new building on the land, according to Mr. Sirois.

"We're not the owner yet of the school. We can't do a lot of stuff yet," he said.

Not only will the school draw students

from Whitchurch-Stouffville, but also those who live up to one hour away by bus, according to Sébastien Lacroix, conseiller aux communications for the conseil scolaire de district catholique Centre-Sud.

Aurora's École secondaire catholique Renaissance opened in 2008, is at capacity and has six portables, Mr. Lacroix said.

"There is a great demand for French Catholic education in the area," he said.

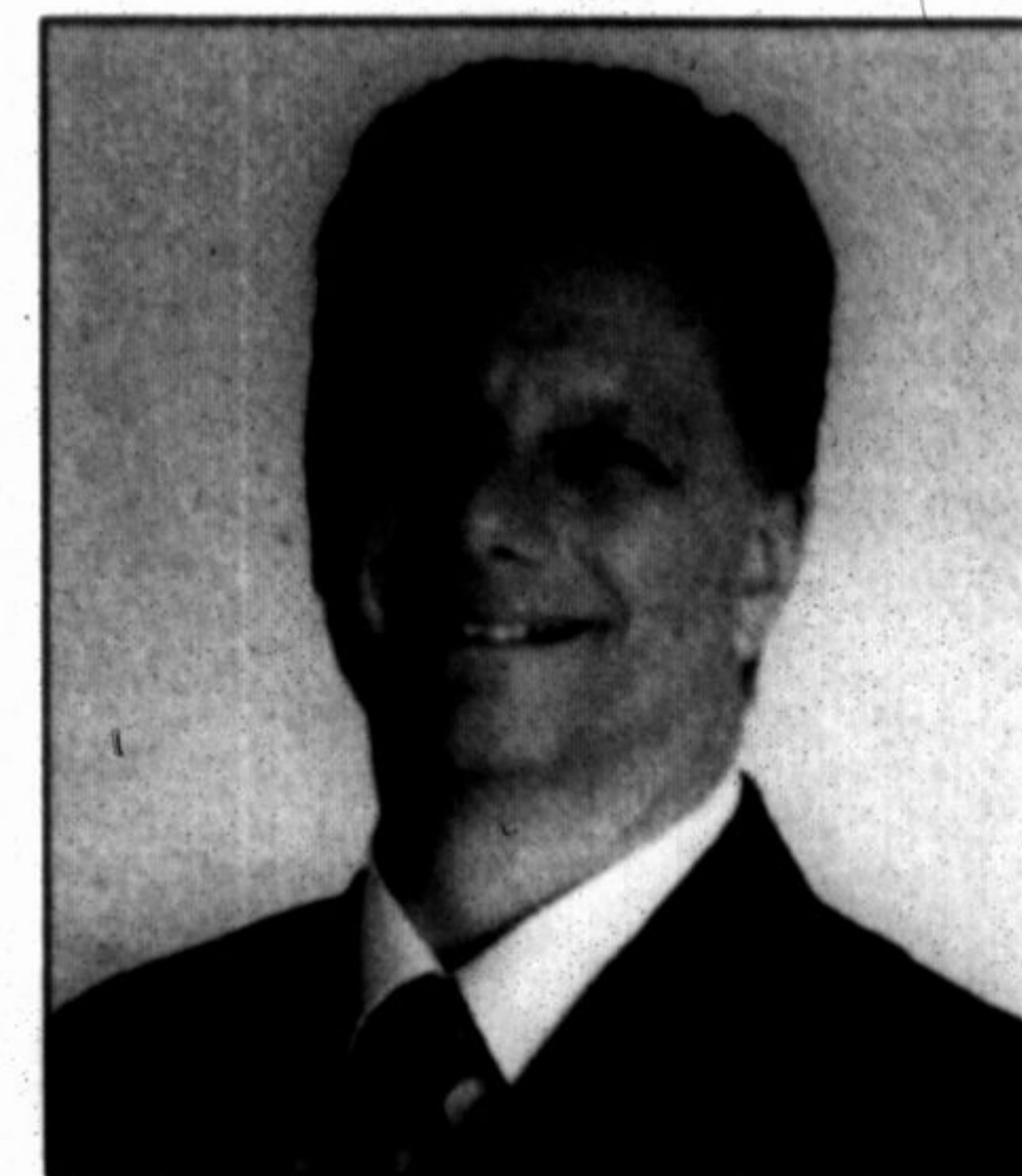
