Folk duo Dala loved performing in Stouffville so much last year, the day after their sold-out show, the pair asked to come back.

"I know that performers love the space" in the Lebovic Centre for Arts and Entertainment - Nineteen on the Park, said Steven Foster, cultural facility and programming co-ordinator for the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville. "They love the connection they have with the audience. The acoustics surprise people.

Dala plays a seasonal concert Dec. 19 and are just one of six shows returning to the arts centre during the 2012/2013 professional series. Also returning is Motus O's A Christmas Carol, the Local Artist Showcase, Chris McKhool's Celebrate! Holidays of the Global Village, Motus O's Circus Terrifico and Yuk Yuk's on Tour.

Orchestras have Messiah. Ballets have The Nutcracker and Stouffville has A Christmas Carol. This is the fourth year Motus O has performed it at the downtown arts centre. It will also be on the 2013 schedule.

"It's attracting new audiences each year," Mr. Foster said.

New to the Christmas season is the Sound of Music Sing-Along. Think Rocky Horror Picture Show viewings, but with yodelling, nun habits and German soldiers.

"Possibly, it could become a tradition." Mr. Foster said.
