

# IF YOU WORK IN ONTARIO, THIS IS YOUR FIGHT.

On September 11, 2012, the Ontario Liberal government passed Bill 115, the Putting Students First Act, 2012.

### Bill 115 is undemocratic, unconstitutional, and unprecedented.
